Newsbrief

Chief Adviser to the interim government Professor Dr. Muhammad Yunus placed a wreath at the Shikha Anirban at Dhaka Cantonment, paying tributes to the martyred members of the armed forces who sacrificed their lives in the Great War of Liberation. After placing the wreath, the Chief Adviser signed the visitor's book kept at the Shikha Anirban, an ISPR press release said yesterday.

The Chief Advisor of the interim government Prof. Dr. Muhammad Yunus yesterday issued a message marking one-month of the student-people uprising. In the Message, the Chef Adviser said, Bangladeshis are celebrating the first month of Bangladesh's second independence. Hundreds of students and people of all walks of life made the supreme sacrifice for one of the most glorious revolutions in history, the Chief Adviser added.

Adviser to the interim government on the Ministries of Finance, Commerce, Science and Technology Dr. Salehuddin Ahmed said, the government will form a taskforce to recover laundered money. The Adviser said this while talking to reporters after a meeting with representatives of buying houses at his Secretariat office in the capital yesterday. Salehuddin, however, mentioned that prices of essential goods will decrease within a few months.

The Anti-discrimination Student Movement yesterday brought out the 'Shaheedi March' across the country to honour the martyrs of the student-people uprising, marking one-month of the fall of the autocratic Awami League regime. The Central March started from the base of the Raju Memorial Sculpture on Dhaka University campus at 3pm while thousands of students from different educational institutions in the city joined the procession with much enthusiasm. The procession ended at the same venue on Raju Sculpture premises. Later, a rally was held on the Raju Sculpture premises while different leaders of the Anti-discrimination Student Movement addressed the rally.

The Advisory Council yesterday formed a committee to examine, update and recast the draft "National Gene Bank Management Policy-2024" for proper conservation and sustainable use of genetic resources to ensure food security facing climate risk. The draft policy was placed in the Advisory Council meeting for approval, said a press release of the Cabinet Division. Adviser for Environment, Forest and Climate Change was made convener of the committee while Agriculture Adviser and Fisheries and Livestock Adviser were also included in it.

France offered technical, legal, and institutional support to help implement the reform agenda of Bangladesh's interim government, with a particular focus on tackling corruption, improving governance, and strengthening the financial system. The offer was made during a meeting between Foreign Affairs Adviser Md. Touhid Hossain and French Ambassador to Bangladesh, Marie Masdupuy at the Foreign Ministry in Dhaka yesterday.

Posts and Telecommunications and Information Technology Adviser Md. Nahid Islam sought the support of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) for reaching the benefits of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) at the marginal level. The Adviser came up with the call when a four-member UNDP delegation led by Stefan Liller paid a courtesy call on him at the office of the Ministry of Posts, Telecommunications and Information Technology in Secretariat yesterday.

The interim government will turn Ganabhaban into a 'July-mass-revolution memorial museum' to preserve the memories of the July revolution, commemorating student-people mass movement against autocratic regime of ousted Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina. Labour and Employment Ministry Adviser Asif Mahmud Shojib Bhuyain revealed the information at a press briefing at Foreign Service Academy in the capital yesterday after a meeting of Advisers' Council held at Chief Adviser's Office (CAO) at Tejgaon with Chief Adviser Professor Dr. Muhammad Yunus in the chair.

The committee on the preparation for the "White Paper on the State of Bangladesh Economy" sought recommendations from the public. The government formed a National Committee to review contracts signed under the Quick Supply of Power and Energy (Special Provisions) Act, 2010 (Amendment 2021). The Ministry of Power, Energy and Mineral Resources issued a notification in this regard yesterday.

The Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) urged all to provide information in recovering illegal firearms as a joint-drive in this connection began from Wednesday's early hours. From September 4 in 2024, a joint operation started to recover all types of illegal weapons, including firearms and ammunitions, said a press release yesterday.

Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) Senior Joint Secretary General Advocate Ruhul Kabir Rizvi Ahmed said, the Election Commission is largely responsible for destroying the country's democracy. The BNP Senior Joint Secretary General told a press conference organized by Agriculturists Association of Bangladesh (AAB) at the BNP's Nayapaltan central office in the capital yesterday.
